

Community Chest Plan Debated at Rotary Meeting

Dr. I. S. Cutter Says Centralized Scheme Is Needed to Put Charity on More Solid Basis.

The plan for a federation of all Omaha welfare agencies with a common budget fund out of which each would draw in proportion to its needs was debated before the Rotary club at its luncheon yesterday. Although no official decision was given, many of the business men present expressed themselves privately as in favor of the project.

Dr. I. S. Cutter, dean of the College of Medicine of the University of Nebraska, who is the author of the plan, which was drawn up by the welfare committee of the Chamber of Commerce after several months of investigation, the financing of charities in other cities. He was opposed by Dr. B. W. Christie.

"A welfare federation and community chest is needed in Omaha to put charitable work on a more solid basis, eliminate the anxiety and annoyance of numerous drives, tag days and subscription solicitations," said Dr. Cutter. "Through the proper coordination of the various agencies duplication can be avoided and after immediate suffering is relieved it will be possible to follow up the work and seek to remove the causes."

Raise Fund in Week.
He explained that if the various relief agencies of the city would enter into a federation, all the money necessary for their maintenance each year would be raised in a single week's campaign in the fall. The budget would be carefully worked out and each agency allotted its proper proportion. These charitable enterprises could center their entire effort on relief work and not be harassed with the problem of raising money. He answered Dr. Christie's claim that the community chest plan would lessen the pleasure of giving because of the substitution of organized for volunteer effort by saying that the support of the needy was a civic and community affair rather than a personal matter.

"The community chest is too much of a machine," Dr. Christie said. "Charity is a sacred thing, and the only good that can come out of it is through personal contact. The chest is simply a supergovernment, and its greatest boosters are employees of the federations in other cities. We will still have tag days, no matter what is said on the subject. The plan may succeed as in other cities for the first year, but it will fail of public support after a short experience."

Cleveland Uses Plan.
In reply to the charge that under the auspices of the Cleveland community chest the amount asked for charity had grown many times, Dr. Cutter showed that this apparent increase was due to the fact that in the beginning only a small majority of the agencies there had operated under the federation but that gradually all except three had come in, and that now practically all the charitable funds of Cleveland were raised by the chest plan.

Instead of lessening public interest in good causes, the community chest method increased it. He told of Kansas City where formerly only 25,000 persons gave to charity, and where this year \$5,000 contributed to the chest. The executive committee of the Chamber of Commerce has endorsed the draft of a plan for the welfare federation. This contemplates a board of 25 governors, 10 chosen by the welfare agencies, 10 chosen by contributors to the fund, and in addition the mayor and four others to be chosen by the other governors.

Fuller to Expose Operations of Klan

Edgar I. Fuller, whose Ku Klux Klan activities were well known in California, has experienced a change of heart.

Fuller, who married Dorothy Sorenson, daughter of wealthy Omahans, made the following announcement to a reporter of The Omaha Bee upon his arrival here yesterday:

"I know that I have done wrong. I got into that mess and now I am going to expose the entire organization of 5,000-600 members."

Fuller stated that he is now employed by several Omahans to gather evidence against the Klan, which he expects will implicate klansmen in the Morehouse parish (La.) murders. He would not make public the names of the men employing him.

Omaha has a Klan organization, Fuller said, but men of prominence are withdrawing rapidly. Fuller was of the opinion that the Omaha branch would be out of existence in a month or two.

Fuller intends to leave today for New York, where he will begin the study of law and at the same time keep in close touch with his investigators. He intends to practice law here.

His wife and baby are enroute to New York.

Relatives Blame Ill Health for Suicide of Thomas J. Lee

Relatives of Thomas J. Lee, Casper, Wyo., who committed suicide by shooting himself in the head at the Hotel Plaza Sunday, arrived in Omaha yesterday to take charge of the body.

They believe that ill health caused his act.

Lee is survived by his mother, daughter and two sisters.
