Mayence, Jan. 25 .- Riots and killings were narrowly averted here tonight when huge crowds of angry Germans ran amuck in the streets because fines were imposed on the Ruhr magnates.

French cavalry finally dispersed the rioters and is now patroling the city. Thousands of Germans, mostly youths, began marching through the streets singing patriotic songs about 8. The objective of all was the hotels where the French officers are quar-


