Intensive search by police detectives has failed to disclose the slightest clue to the identity of the victim of the "shotgun trap" set by

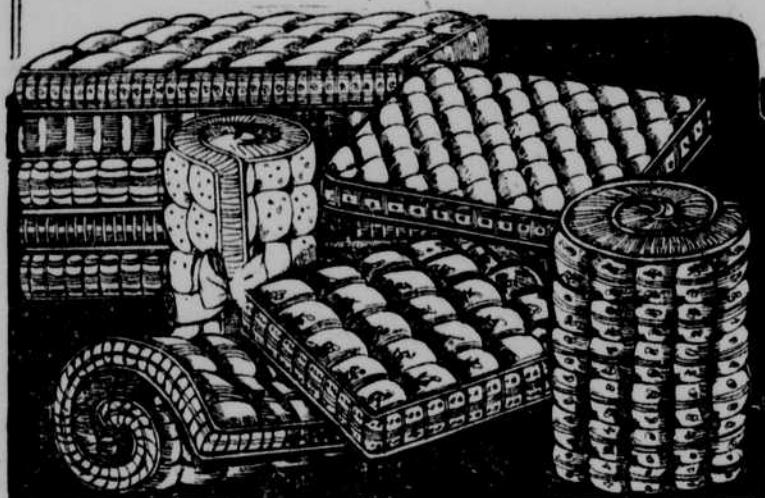
