

Thousands of Texas Cattle Killed by Cold Weather

Beaumont, Tex., Feb. 6. - Range cattle in Jefferson county alone, frozen to death in Sunday and Sunday night's storm, will total 10,000 to 14,000, according to estimates by ranchers of the county. J. C. Eissentrat, county agent who recently completed a livestock census, said that about 40,000 head were on Jefferson county ranges.

J. E. Broussard, a ranch owner, said 33 per cent of his herds had perished. He said he had counted from 300 to 400 dead cattle in his smaller herds. S. W. Pipkin, an-

other rancher, estimated the loss over the county at 35 per cent. R. M. White said he believed he had lost no less than 1,500 head of the 12,000 animals on his ranch.


