

Plan to Consolidate Nebraska and South Dakota Baseball Leagues Is Failure

Failure to Agree on Gate Receipts Cause Nebraska State League to Start Season May 4—Annual Meeting Held at Lincoln.

Lincoln, Feb. 19.—(Special Telegram.)—A proposal to consolidate the Nebraska and South Dakota state leagues into eight club circuit was turned down by the directors of the Nebraska circuit Monday afternoon.

Failure to agree on the matter of distribution of gate receipts proved the first hitch and a second objection was raised to the dropping of two Nebraska towns in order to make the proposed league an eight-club organization.

Directors of the South Dakota circuit, headed by their president, M. E. Cannon, appeared before the Nebraska managers with the plan during the annual meeting of the latter organization. Under this plan there would have been four South Dakota clubs, Aberdeen, Watertown, Sioux Falls and Mitchell and four of the Nebraska clubs.

Failure of the big question mark Fairbury, which the directors present expressed confidence that the Coyotes will be back in the league. George Segrist, owner of the Fairbury franchise was present but stated that he would not take charge of the club there until the Fairbury fans met his proposition.

It was decided to start the season May 4. The matter of playing a split season was not definitely decided. C. J. Miles of Grand Island was re-elected president.

Nebraska league representatives present at the meeting included B. J. Brown and B. T. Parr, Norfolk; C. E. Jackson and Harry Faidley, Grand Island; Harvey Hoffeling, Harry Friday and O. L. Life, Beatrice; George Segrist, Fairbury; O. E. and James Beltzer and C. N. Moon, Lincoln.

One of the important measures adopted was a resolution providing for the payment of more money to umpires in order to insure better officiating.

Joe Moore Files Up Lead on Skates

Moncton, N. B., Feb. 19.—Joe Moore, New York speed skater, piled up a big lead in the first day's events of the Canadian maritime ice championships today, winning both the half-mile and mile events and placing third in the 220-yard dash.

Moore's total of 70 points was more than double that of Charles Gorman of St. John, N. B., who finished with 30 points as a result of his victory in the 220-yard event.

Charles Jewtraw, Lake Placid flash, sprinted to a new world's record in 18 1/5 seconds for 220 yards in an exhibition race, but did not take part in the championship events. Jewtraw's time was three-fifths of a second faster than the record he created last week at St. John, where he won the international outdoor title.
