Washington, Feb. 27. - President Harding today effected the greatest change his cabinet has undergone since his administration began nearly two years ago by designating Dr. Hubert Work of Colorado, now postmaster general, to be secretary of the interior, succeeding Albert B. Fall of New Mexico, and Senator Harry S. New of Indiana to head the postoffice department in succession to Dr. Work.

The nominations of Dr. Work and enator New were sent to the senate and promptly confirmed, that of Senator New almost immediately in open session in accordance with the courtesy always extended sitting senators and that of Dr. Work late in the day after it had been referred to cor mittee in open/session and reported back. 
