

Judge Sears to Resign March 4

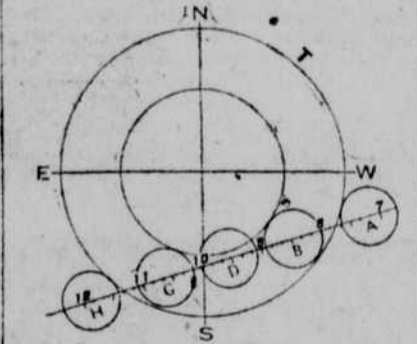
Bryan Says He Will Not Be Guided by Referendum in Naming Successor.

"Extra" Baby Admitted to U. S. by Being Assigned to Russian Quota.

Mr. and Mrs. Moser Epstein of Warsaw and family, including the baby born just before they left for this country, will be in Omaha within the next few days.

After puzzling over the matter for several days, during which the Epsteins were held at Ellis Island, immigration officials have solved the problem of how to legally admit the baby to this country.

The passport did not call for the admittance of the baby, and to add to the complications, the quota of immigrants from Poland for the month was completed.

"It was the humane thing to do," was the comment of Harry Lapidus, who with the Jewish Welfare association, took an interest in the case.
