Omaha Grain

Omaha, March 3.—Omaha grain receipts totaled 132 cars as compared with 163 cars last year. Total shipments were 147 cars against 115 cars a year ago.

Cash prices of wheat on the Omaha market were somewhat lower but there was a fair demand at the decline. Samples changing hands at generally 2 cents lower. Corn followed the lead of other grains and sold 1 to 1 1/2-cents lower.

Light rains were general over the entire southwest, with a prospect for continuing over Sunday and this caused a very weak market with corn and oats sympathizing. Prices at the start were only slightly lower, but as the grain reports continued to come in selling increased in volume and the reaching of stop orders on the way down accelerated the downward movement.
