

200-Year Violin Brought in Pieces to Be Repaired
The repair department of the Schmoller & Mueller Piano company has just received for repair a violin which dates back about 200 years. H. A. Patterson, 4142 Grant street, who has owned the instrument for more than 50 years, brought it to the store

in about nine different pieces. Mr. Patterson received the violin from his uncle, G. W. Langford, of London, England, as a reward for his ability. Mr. Langford paid about 100 pounds for it when he purchased it from a friend. Scratched on the inside of the violin is the record that it was repaired in 1804 when the neck was broken at
