'The organization has no religious scruples and believes in the upholding of the rights of a free and enlightened people to choose their own religion and to worship God according to the dictates of their own

Fuller, who claims to be the originator of the American Fascisti, states that he intends to make Omaha his home after his survey of the United States that took him to almost every part of the country where his agents report great progress in the new






