

Friendship Cure to World's Ills

Hughes Stresses Value of Amity in Message to Pan-American Congress.

Washington, March 27.—A plea that nations set themselves forcibly to the task of removing every remnant of suspicion, distrust and hatred and earnestly seek the cure for their ills, which is found only in friendship and good faith, was made by Secretary Hughes in a message to the fifth Pan-American conference in Santiago, Chile, delivered by Ambassador Henry P. Fletcher, head of the delegation from the United States. More formal arrangements between nations, the message said, are futile in the absence of good will.

The assertion was made that the conference should "buttress the foundations of amity" and take "full advantage of its opportunities" in that direction. The real value of the conference was declared to rest in the fact it "generated powerful currents of mutual understanding and friendly interest" supplying the motive power by which injurious influence might be overcome.

Dedicated to Peace.

The statement follows in part: "It is with the deepest regret that I have found it impossible to attend the opening of the fifth Pan American conference. At a time when we witness the economic dislocations, the impoverishment, the distrust and hatred that have resulted from the great war we have good reason to concentrate on our peoples that peace reigns in this hemisphere, and the meeting of this conference affords a welcome opportunity to dedicate ourselves anew to the ideals of peace.

Present experiences, reinforcing the lessons of history, cause fresh recognition of the futility of mere formal arrangements in the absence of good will, and the permanent value of the conference lies in the fact that here are generated powerful currents of mutual understanding and friendly interest supplying the motive power through which any remnants of suspicion and distrust may be removed and the injurious influences of earlier antagonisms may be overcome.

Solution For All Problems.

"All problems find solution among those who desire to be friendly and just, and the present imperative demand of civilization itself is that nations shall set themselves to the elimination of sources of controversy and shall earnestly and diligently seek for their manifold ills, the cures which can only be found in friendship and good faith.

"There are happily no controversies among us that cannot be settled by the processes of reason. We rejoice in an expanding life; we are proud of our traditions and achievements; we all desire the development of resources, increased facilities of education and the improvement of common lot of humanity. This conference means the practical direction of our material and spiritual forces to gain for all the American republics the enhanced prosperity which waits on the friendly collaboration of states secure in their recognized equality of their mutual respect and in the supremacy of the common sentiment of justice.

Holland May Follow Lead of U. S. on Prohibition Issue

New York, March 27.—Holland, famous for its gin and schnapps, is preparing to follow the United States in banishing intoxicating liquors, N. A. Devries, member of the Dutch government, declared yesterday after visiting federal prohibition headquarters.

"My impression of the people of this country is very few really know anything about the prohibition question," he said. "Only those responsible for its enactment and enforcement understand, while the rest have no time to study the situation or are indifferent."

Devries, with H. Vandermeulen, president of the Dutch Prohibition society, will end their visits here within a week and will begin a four-month tour of the United States, in which they will visit the principal cities.

Republican Committee Defends New Tariff Law

Washington, March 27.—The present speculation in sugar is no more attributable to the Fordney-McCumber tariff, the republican national committee declared last night, than was the recent speculation in Piggy Wiggly stock.

Declaring the prevailing duties on sugar were 4 to 11 1/4 cents greater than the Underwood tariff, the statement contended that "to assert that an increase in tariff of a cent a pound causes an advance of 6 to 8 cents a pound in the price of sugar is to give utterance to clotted nonsense.

"Democratic politicians, free trade advocates and a large class of demagogues and agitators who are attempting to make political capital out of the present sugar situation," it was added, "are working hand in glove with sugar speculators."

Big Sisters to Help Fill Omaha's "Community Chest"

Big Sisters, an Omaha welfare organization, has voted to co-operate in the "community chest."

Announcement was made Tuesday in a letter written by Mayhew H. Casey, president, to the public welfare committee of the Chamber of Commerce. Big Sisters is the 27th organization to vote to co-operate.

Texas Man Sentenced to Death Three Times; Faces Two More Trials

Waco, Tex., March 27.—Roy Mitchell, with five minutes' jury deliberation last evening, was found guilty of the murder of Grady Skipworth, at Lover's Leap, in Cameron park, here, November 29 and sentenced to death.

This is the third death penalty given Mitchell within 19 days. In the trial charging him with the murder of W. E. Holt the jury deliberated just nine minutes before returning a verdict assessing death, and in trial for murder of Mrs. Ethel Jacobs Deneamp, Holt's companion, on the night of January 19, but four minutes elapsed between the retirement of the jury and its report on a death penalty.

The man is to be tried on two more murder charges, the killing of Harold Bolton, almost a year ago, and the slaying of W. A. Driskell, early in 1922.

British Farm Laborers Are Called Out on Strike

Norwich, England, March 27.—A farm laborers of Norfolk county were called on strike Monday by the executive committee of the Farmers' union rejected the proposal of the laborers for a three months' truce in order to place the entire agricultural problem before the government and also declined a suggestion made by Sir Robert A. Sanders, minister of agriculture, to submit the dispute to an independent arbitrator.

The strike has not yet become general. The laborers' union is insisting that all the farm workers must strike, with either nonunion and union irrespective of what wages they are receiving.

Coroner's Jury Decides Banker Committed Suicide

Chicago, March 27.—A coroner's jury yesterday returned a verdict that Fred W. Popp, former president of the Logan Square Trust and Savings bank which was closed two weeks ago after Popp's body was found in an automobile, had come to his death as a result of suicide "while despondent over the possible loss of his bank."

Announcement was made that the bank would be reopened as a reorganized institution Wednesday.

Milk Law Offered.

Mayor Dahlman offered to city council Tuesday morning an ordinance which provides for several amendments in the present health department regulations to dairies and the sale and distribution of milk and milk products.
