

### U. S. Officers Start War on Drug Traffic

#### Two Arrests Made in Drive to Disclose Dope Caches Believed Stored in Bluffs.

As a result of the discovery last week that Council Bluffs is a wholesaler of dope, a drive to disclose the caches of narcotics in other cities in this vicinity, particularly Omaha, federal narcotic agents began operations here Tuesday night.

Two arrests already have been made, a quantity of drugs has been seized and further developments are expected to materialize, J. A. Manning and W. A. Carroll are the government sleuths conducting the investigation.

Accompanied by Patrolman Walter H. Brown of the police department, they arrested Dan McKay and Earl Van Winkle near Fifth avenue and Main street Tuesday night. A quantity of cube morphine was found in their possession.

The fact that the men had been loitering suspiciously in the vicinity with the drug upon their persons leads the federal men to believe that the tenacles of the retail dope traffic have begun to fasten themselves upon the community.

The original theory which prompted the investigation of conditions in the Bluffs was that Omaha wholesalers maintain large caches or plants of narcotic supplies on this side of the river, removing the drugs in smaller quantities to supply the demand of the retail traffic.

The same plan was followed during the days of whisky runners, who brought carloads of booze from Kansas City and planted them in the Bluffs. Trips from the Bluffs to Omaha were made with small loads and their loss, if arrested on the bridge, never was heavy.

Federal men say that Council Bluffs is comparatively free from dope users and that, consequently, narcotic agents very rarely operate in this community. This fact makes the location ideal for establishment of huge wholesale caches of drugs.

Examination of the "morphine" by Federal Narcotics Agent Manning of Omaha revealed it to be chalk. Manning said he believed the men carried the chalk as a "blind" for more serious operations.

#### Fear Spread of Farm Strike.

### Brakeman Talks Hour After Body Cut in Two

Martinsburg, W. Va., March 28.—His body severed in two, C. E. Moore, 30, brakeman on a Baltimore & Ohio train, lived over an hour and talked calmly with fellow trainmen until the end came today in a local hospital. Moore is believed to have fallen from the freight train.

### Klansmen in U. S. Jobs in Texas Are Dismissed

Dallas, Tex., March 28.—Carrying out "its declared opposition to the Ku Klux Klan," the republican party of Texas through its executive committee has ordered and already begun the dismissal from federal service all government employees known to be klansmen, R. B. Creager of Brownsville, chairman of the state republican executive committee, said in an announcement here today.

### Escaped Convicts Caught.

Atlanta, Ga., March 28.—Gerald Chapman and Frank Grey, desperadoes, who escaped yesterday from the Atlanta federal penitentiary, were captured today after a gun battle with the pursuing posse in a dense woodland near Athens, Ga., according to reports received here. Chapman, "master mind" of a \$3,000,000 mail truck robbery in New York, was shot through the hip. His companion was taken unharmed.

### Driver Escapes, Team Drowned

#### Dairy Wagon and Horses Caught in Flood When Bridge Gives Way.

Special Dispatch to The Omaha Bee. Shenandoah, Ia., March 28.—When flood waters of the N. Shna river undermined the center piling, the Avers bridge collapsed with Kenneth Men-

gee who was driving a wagon. Mengee escaped, but the team was drowned in the flood. When Mengee, who is employed by J. D. Wolfe, dairyman, drove an empty wagon onto the bridge, the structure sank. As the bridge went down, the rear end upheaved and caught the wagon under the hind wheels and held it suspended in the air, the front in the water with the struggling horses. Mengee climbed to safety. The horses were valued at \$375 by Mr. Wolfe. More than 3,300 airplanes were built in France last year.

### Cold in Chicago.

Chicago, March 28.—Today was the coldest March 28, with one exception, in the history of the Chicago weather bureau. The government thermometer registered 14 degrees above zero at 9 a. m. today, and two hours later, notwithstanding bright sunshine, had advanced only 3 degrees. On March 28, 1887, the official temperature in Chicago was 9 degrees above zero at 9 a. m. Duluth, Minn., reported 14 degrees below zero early today.

### Slaying in Dublin Theater.

Dublin, March 28.—Lieut. Frank Teeling, a national army officer, whose escape from jail while under death sentence for alleged complicity in Dublin's "red Sunday" massacre in November, 1920, and was one of the greatest sensations of the black and tan regime in Ireland, was a central figure in a scene at the Theater Royal last night. During the performance a shot was heard and a member of the civic force fell, wounded in the heart. He died soon after. Lieutenant Teeling was arrested in connection with the mysterious occurrence.
