Threatens Sammy Carmell With Detention Home If He Plays Before Theater Audience.

"As soon as Sammy Carmell puts his foot on any Omaha stage to play a violin as an entertainer, I will put him in Riverview home." District Judge Day declared in juvenile court Saturday morning.

"He will be immediately taken into custody by juvenile officers, should he attempt it. This was also the attitude of Dep-

uty Labor Commissioner Larsen, who declared that the boy would become technically delinquent upon his appearance before an audience.

"The law is very plain," he said. Sammy Carmell, boy violinist, protege of the Nebraska Society for the Development of Musical Talent, theater April 14 to aid the society in Brown Park district.

He appeared in juvenile court Saturday morning after a test appearance

"This is not a regular, but a 'framed' case, and this court does not at this time find Sammy Carmell a delinquent child under the statute," udge Day said. "The case is connued to April 14. The boy is reurned to his parents until further order of the court. He may be called for further hearing at the discretion of the chief juvenile probation of-
