Endicott, resident of Crab Orchard. this county, who, with his 3-year-old son, Vivian, was returning home from Tecunisch in an auto truck this, afternoon, escaped death by a narrow margin when he ran into Burlington eastbound passenger train No. 98 near Vesta, five miles west of here. The truck crashed into the coal tender and, turning sideways, followed the track, breaking out three windows in a coach and smashing in the baggage car door. Endicott was thrown clear. receiving serious head bruises and an injured hip. The boy apparently was protected by cushions of the truck seat and was not seriously hurt.
