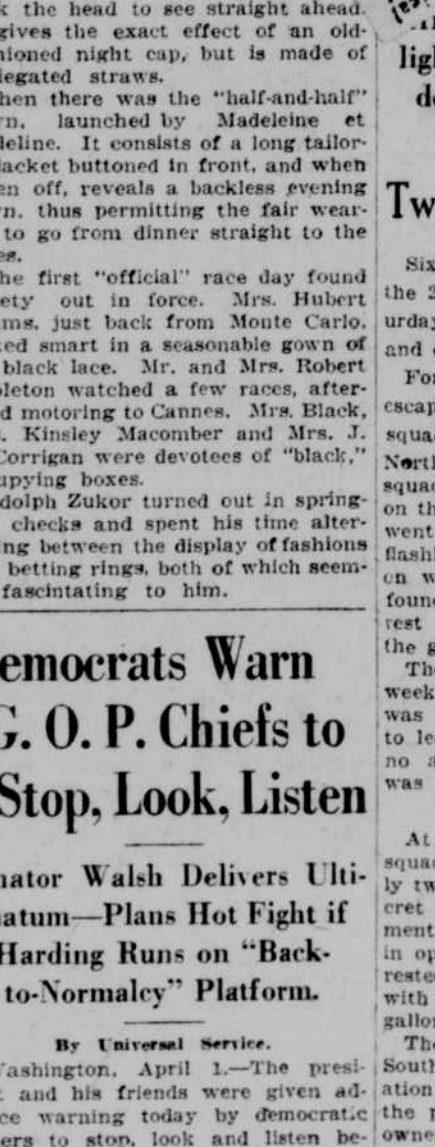
Twins Weigh 17 Pounds
