Body of Missing Turkish Deputy Is Discovered

By Associated Press.

Constantinople, April 2 .- The body of All Chukri Bey, deputy from Erzerum to the Turkish national assembly at Angora, who has been missing for some days, has been found buried near the home of the notorious Osman Agha. The body was fully clothed. Osman Agha has disappeared.

Chukri Bey was one of the founders of the newspaper Tan, which has consistently opposed the policies of Mustapha Kemal Pasha, nationalist leader. After his disappearance one of his colleagues hinted in a speech before the assembly that he had fallen a victim to his political opinions.




