

Conference to Curb Dope Evil Well Received

Many Foreign and State Governments Respond to Invitations for Parley in Washington Next Month.

Washington, April 4.—Foreign and state governments are responding with enthusiastic interest to invitations to participate in the national antinarcotic conference in Washington, May 3 and 4. It was announced by Roxford L. Holmes, executive secretary.

The Norwegian and Italian governments already have definitely accepted and signified that they will appoint representatives. Four governors likewise have stated that they will appoint representatives to take part. Medical schools, religious societies and welfare organizations in all parts of the country are pledging co-operation.

Sir Auckland Geddes, the British ambassador, in a reply to the invitation sent his government, has expressed his "personal sincere agreement" with the purposes of the conference. Great Britain is expected to have a representative participate, although as yet the invitation has not been accepted.

Ambassador to Attend.

Indicating Italy's interest in the world-wide movement to eradicate the habit-forming drug menace, its ambassador in Washington, (Gelasio Casetani), has been instructed to participate in the conference.

The Norwegian minister, H. Bryn, has appointed the newly designated commercial councillor of the legation, Alexis Lundh, as the official Norwegian representative.

Mexico, according to Mr. Holmes, probably will send a technical representative to speak.

The four states whose governors have already replied that they will designate representatives are Maryland, Oklahoma, Mississippi and Pennsylvania.

Outlines Purposes.

Outlining the purposes of the conference, Dr. William K. McKibbin, executive secretary of the International Anti-Narcotic society, known as the "white cross," issued a statement which said in part:

"The narcotic scourge is coming to be seen for what it actually is, namely, the greatest danger that menaces humanity. If anyone doubts this, look at a country like China. The untold wretchedness, misery, degradation fastened on the Chinese through opium constitute one of the darkest chapters in modern history.

"The determination of the American people not to yield to the fate thrust upon China has just found expression in an act unanimously passed by congress and immediately signed by President Harding, and already put into operation by Secretary of State Hughes.

"This measure, the Porter resolution, will, in days to come, be regarded as the most significant narcotic legislation ever enacted. The resolution strikes at the very root of the evil. It demands that the nations that have been raising the poppy plant and coca shrub from which opium and cocaine are derived, must pull up these plants and make an end of these poisonous substances for once and forever, except for the comparatively small amount needed for medicine."
