

Nebraska and Iowa Movie Men Oppose Hays' Contract

Exhibitors Vote Approval of New Film Distributing Company Being Organized by Officers of Association—Strong Delegation From Two States Will Attend National Convention.

Motion picture exhibitors of Nebraska and Iowa, meeting at the Hotel Fontenelle yesterday, refused to accept the Will H. Hays uniform contract and in a second resolution pledged their support to Sidney H. Cohen, national president of the Motion Picture Theater Owners of America, who is fighting Hays on the matter of an equitable uniform contract. The exhibitors also voted their approval of the new film distribution company being organized under the auspices of the officers of the association. The company, when in operation, will compete for the business of the show houses against the "regular" companies now in control and whom the exhibitors charge with unjustly high rentals for films. Plans were made for a strong delegation of Nebraska and Iowa men to attend the national convention in Chicago next month.

Author's Wails Heard.

Peter B. Kyne, author, is in the midst of a wordy battle embellished with much vituperation on both sides, his opponents being stars and directors of motion pictures. Mr. Kyne declares that pictures are terrible, that stories are ruined in tone, and so forth. In answer, Tom Forman, who directed "Cappy Ricks" and others of Kyne's stories, states that, although Mr. Kyne was dissatisfied, he could not point out any definite faults or changes to be made and that in the Forman film versions of the Cappy Ricks stories he held very closely to the texts.
