

### Omaha May Be Given New Postoffice

Postal Commission, Investigating Conditions at Local Office, Says Congestion Must Be Relieved.

A survey of postoffice space and facilities made here today by the postal commission of Washington may result in a new postoffice for Omaha, E. H. McDermott, secretary of the commission, said before he left the city late yesterday afternoon.

Conditions here are very crowded and something will have to be done to relieve the congestion, said Mr. McDermott. "There are two ways of doing this. One way is to build a new postoffice building and the other is to rent additional space at high rents."

Congress to Act. Mr. McDermott, who is secretary of the joint congressional commission on postal service, aided by P. A. McGurty, made a survey of the postoffice in conjunction with the review of charts, maps and reports sent to him sometime ago by Postmaster Charles E. Black.

Mr. McDermott said that the recommendations of his commission will be sent to congress and it is hoped that congress will act favorably and quickly on the findings because of the general crowded conditions of the postoffices of many large cities of the country.

Leave for Denver. "We are traveling only to the large cities," he said. "We are not making any recommendations concerning personnel, but are only determining needs for additional space and facilities and ascertaining the general conditions for handling the mails."

Mr. McDermott and party left for Denver. They will tour the Pacific coast.

### Women Refused Labor School

Slice of Garland Fund Withheld Because A. F. of L. Not "Radical."

Washington, April 14.—Because the Workers Education Bureau, an organization of the American Federation of Labor, is not "definitely committed to a radical program," the American Fund for Public Service, Inc., has refused to include the bureau among beneficiaries in its outlay of the \$800,000 fund turned over to it by Charles Garland of Boston, out of the rejected inheritance from his father.

Attempt to Control Miners. A statement made public by the United Mine Workers of America declared that those who are in control of the Garland fund are "making a desperate but vain attempt to control and dictate the policies of the coal miners' union."

Slap Back at Gompers. New York, April 13.—Officials of the American Fund for Public Service, tonight issued a statement asserting that the attack made upon it by Samuel Gompers, president of the American Federation of Labor, was "clearly the result of his disappointment and not respect for an enterprise in which he is interested."

Only Minimum Step. Harding's world court plan as presented by Hoover Wednesday night seems to have met with entire approval, the only objection heard to it has been that it is "the minimum step."

Pledges to Budget. Seventy-five thousand dollars was raised in an "hoop" time Friday morning toward the national budget. This is half the total required.
