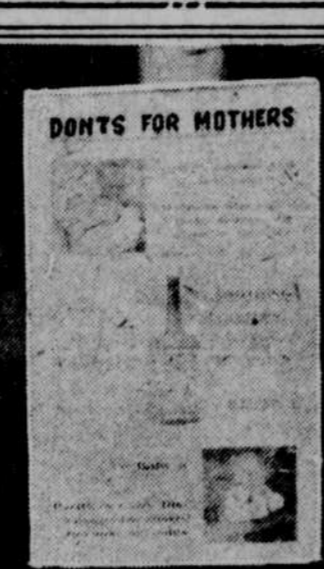

A., the particular advantage for them being that a nurse may be obtained by the hour. Special departments are maintained, such as tuberculosis, maternity, infant welfare and orthopedic.
