

Irate Brother of Girl Breaks Up Marathon Dance

Champion, on Floor More Than 104 Hours, Taken From Hall by Force—Partner "Feeling Fine."

Cuthbert, Ga., April 21.—Miss Margaret Ebbetta, latest champion long-distance dancer, who hung up her record of 104 hours and 40 minutes, ended her marathon in hysterics this afternoon. When her brother rushed into the dance hall and dragged her half-fainting, but still resisting, from the floor.
"You'll stop or I'll kill you," shouted the irate brother, seizing his sister in his arms and dragging her toward the door.
"I shan't go. I shan't go," she screamed, fighting at him with fingernails and teeth.
The brother carried her to an automobile outside and ordered the chauffeur to drive away.
Miss Ebbetta began her dance Tuesday with Tom E. Jackson and at the finish she was in better condition than her partner. Jackson fainted after dancing 103 hours and 20 minutes, but after being revived, again took the floor and continued the dance, going one hour and 20 minutes longer.
"I'm feeling fine," Jackson said when his partner had been taken forcibly from his arms.

U. S. Marine and Ex-Soldier Out After Marathon Record

Washington, April 21.—One lusty, deep-chested marine, locked in an embrace with a former cavalryman, held the floor at a dance hall in northwest Washington tonight, while downtown at another hall, two men and one woman, equally hardy, trod the floor with flagging steps—sole survivors of the 37 persons who started out Wednesday night to break all endurance dancing records.
Meanwhile half a dozen victims of the craze, who at various periods had dropped out of the grueling contests from exhaustion were in hospitals or under the care of physicians at their homes, and city authorities were seeking means to prevent such exhibitions in the future.
The marine and the cavalryman tonight commanded the greatest interest. The "leatherneck" declared to be a marvel of physical development, is Aubrey Gilbert of Clarkdale, Miss., and he faces charges of "absence without leave," unless he "brings home the bacon." His antagonist, Josef Bols-trosky, has announced that he will see the finish.
As midnight approached the dancers seemed to gather a little strength and at both dance halls a faster pace was set. Trucks were backed up at the doors of both places ready to make a run out of the district to escape the Sunday law. Photographs were ahead.

St. Mary Alumni to Hold Campaign Drive Will Be Made Among Alumni in Omaha—Dinner Tuesday.

Dr. Bryan M. Riley of Omaha, president of St. Mary College Alumni association, branch 9, has announced the opening of an endowment drive among alumni here for the Kansas institution. Former Representative From Pennsylvania Dies

Washington, April 21.—Former Representative John M. Rose of Pennsylvania died here late tonight after a long illness.
Mr. Rose, who served in the last congress, became ill shortly before the session adjourned. His illness, which developed into pneumonia, was complicated by heart trouble.
A republican in politics, Mr. Rose was elected to congress to represent the Nineteenth Pennsylvania district in the sixty-fifth, sixty-sixth and sixty-seventh congresses. He was a native of Johnstown.

Ex-Kaiser Suffering From Brain Storms

London, April 21.—Former Kaiser Wilhelm, one time ruler of a powerful nation of 60,000,000, is suffering from "brain storms" in his exile in Holland, said a Doorn dispatch to the Daily Mail tonight.
Reports were printed recently in European and American newspapers that both the former emperor and the former German crown prince were failing mentally.
"Ex-Kaiser Wilhelm is not mad, but he is morbid," said the Doorn dispatch. "An old abscess in the inner part of the ear is causing deafness and 'brain storms.' The attending physicians are worried."
Wilhelm underwent a rejuvenating course of treatment, but the effect is wearing off. He had morbid intervals and spends much time poring over the Bible. His health is falling rapidly.
"The crown prince is mentally all right, but is bored to distraction in his lonely home on Wieringen island."

Judge Held Court With Jug at Feet, Witness Declares

Former Jailer Charges Florida County Officials "All Got Drunk Together"—Sheriff Was Leader.

Tallahassee, Fla., April 21.—Drunk-ness, publicly as well as in private, by the peace officers of Leon county, from the county judge down, was charged in testimony before the joint legislative committee investigating alleged abuses of prisoners in Florida brought about by the death, in a convict camp at Clara, of Martin Tabert, North Dakota youth.
Jerry Poppell, ex-jailer, was the star witness of the day, and a most extraordinary witness he proved to be. Chairman Stokes of the committee asked Poppell if he ever got drunk. Poppell replied:
"There ain't any use lying about it. I got drunk, too. We all got drunk together."

Judge Got Drunk

"You mean to say the county judge got drunk and the sheriff got drunk, and the jailer got drunk, and Deputy Gray got drunk, and Deputy Barrineau got drunk?" inquired Stokes.
"Yes," replied Poppell.
"Did you ever see Willis drunk?" Stokes asked.
"You just ought to see the hunting license he wrote for me last fall," Poppell replied. "He couldn't read it himself now. He was drunk when he wrote it."
Poppell told of hoboes and bootleggers being picked up by the sheriff's officers and being taken before Judge Willis for trial as late as 9 or 10 at night, receiving sentences of 60 to 90 days and being railroaded next day or the day after to the Putnam Lumber company's camp at Clara to serve out their sentences. Asked how the judge happened to be at his office that late at night, Poppell replied:
"He stayed there most of the time so that he could be by his denizen."
"So while all of you were drunk you brought in and tried other men for being drunk?" Stokes asked.
"Yes, and the judge had his jug right under the desk between his feet when he tried them," Poppell replied.

Served 25 Years

Poppell, who said he had served as a jailer for 25 years previous to his discharge last December, swore he had never drunk whiskey until Jones became sheriff and that Jones gave him his first drink. Asked how long Jones had been sheriff, he replied:
"Only this one term. He ran for it three times before he was elected but I can't find anyone now who says he voted for him."
Poppell testified of alleged mistreatment of prisoners confined in the Leon county jail. He told of Carrie Green being taken to a woods a mile from the jail and flogged by the sheriff, his two deputies and himself, and of the sheriff threatening to hang her. The hanging failed to come off, Poppell explained, because after they had the rope around her neck they were "all too drunk to climb the tree" to get it over a limb.

Two Members of Murder Ring Sentenced to Death

Charlottesville, Va., April 21.—Two more members of the Clarkburg blackhand murder syndicate were sentenced to die today while a third was sent to the penitentiary for 10 years.
"Dapper Dick" Ferri and Philip Cannizzaro, convicted of murdering Frank Naples, said to be one of the many victims of the gang, will be hanged at the state penitentiary at Mountville on June 22. Philip Miesche, indicted as an accessory, pleaded guilty to second degree murder and was given the maximum, 18 years.
Nick Salamante, convicted in the Naples case a week ago, is to be hanged June 22. Patsy Corbi of Baltimore was found guilty of first degree murder with a recommendation of life imprisonment.

Huge Ferryboat Plowing Way to Ice-Locked Isle

Boat Expected to Reach Marooned Party Today—Sixth Airplane Hops Off From Chicago.

Chicago, April 21.—The sixth airplane to take part in the attempt to relieve the nine men and one woman marooned and starving on Fox island, in ice-locked Lake Michigan, departed from Chicago today despite admissions that the story of suffering at the camp was a hoax perpetrated to get tobacco for the woodcutters on the island.
From Frankfort, Mich., some 70 miles south of the island, came reports that a huge ice crushing car ferry belonging to the Ann Arbor railroad was on its way to the island and expected to arrive there before daylight Sunday to determine definitely the condition of the islanders.

Woman Guarded Food

Charlevoix, Mich., April 21.—Grim details of how nine men and one woman were on the verge of starvation for three weeks, of how the woman, had guarded the scant supplies from the ravenous men and how work had ceased and disorder had broken forth, when only beans and frozen potatoes remained, were told today by Frank J. Parker of Chicago, owner of the rescue plane that landed on Fox island.

Woman Guarded Food

For three weeks the party on the island had nothing to eat but frozen potatoes and beans, Parker told newspaper men. He said he had had talks with the men on the island during the 18 hours he was stranded there and was sure of the conditions.
Work had stopped, Parker said, and Nels Ask, foreman of the Wood cutters was having difficulty handling the situation.

Four Men Killed When Airplane Dives Into River

Big Bombing Ship Crashes Shortly After Takeoff When Pilot Attempts to Avoid Striking Bridge.

Dayton O., April 21.—Four men were almost instantly killed and one other probably fatally injured this afternoon when a Martin air service bombing plane nose-dived into the great Miami river here. The dead are: Capt. W. R. Lawson, pilot, Langley field, Va.; Technical Sergeant Bidwell, Langley field; Sgt. Wesley H. Rowland, Selfridge field, Michigan, and Civilian U. M. Smith, bureau of standards, Washington.
The injured: Technical Sgt. F. B. Shaw, Selfridge field, Michigan.
All five men suffered fractured skulls. The accident occurred as the men were taking off for Langley field after having been here for several weeks. The big plane left the ground heading south, but owing to a heavy

wind, witnesses said, it was evident that the pilot realized that he could not clear the Herman avenue bridge, just south of McCook field, and sought to turn his plane to avoid crashing into it. The strong wind caught the machine and twisted it into a nose-dive which ended in the river.
All the men in the plane had parachutes on their backs, but were unable to use them on account of the suddenness of the fall, the plane being only a short distance from the ground at the time it dived.
Brig. Gen. William Mitchell, assistant chief of the air service, immediately appointed a board of investigation.

had to rescue a Briguet airplane which fell with its pilot, John Miller, its owner, Francis J. Parker of Chicago, and two Chicago newspaper men.
The Miller plane made a forced landing on the island while trying to carry 200 pounds of food to the supposedly starving inhabitants. It was located a few hours later by another plane which dropped bundles of food to the islanders and then returned to the mainland after asserting that the Miller party was uninjured and hoped to repair their machine.
In all six airplanes have taken part in the effort to carry food to the island, two of them being wrecked on the mainland within sight of their destination, another disabled on the island, a fourth lost in a fog, while the remaining two tonight were still waiting an opportunity to land.
