An elaborate program of interesting and vital features has been arranged for the national convention of the Women's Overseas Service League to be held at order in Chicago, Ill., June 14 to 17. Among the speakers of national and international prominence who have been invited to attend are: Gen. John J. Pershing; Chairman John Barton Payne, of the American Red Cross, and Herbert Hoover, secretary of commerce. Convention headquarters will be located at the Hotel Drake.

will preside. She is supervising arrangements for the convention at the national headquarters of the league, in the central division office of the Red Cross in Chicago. According to reports at hand from every section of the nation, Miss Wells believes that a record attendance will be recorded at the convention. A number of co-operating welfare organizations and agencies will be represented at the annual event, and will participate actively in the program. Miss Anita Phipps, head of the women's relations department of the United States army; Mrs. Frances Rogers of New York City, founder of the first soldiers' and sailors' post war camps; Judge Bartholomew, of Chicago, and a number of others interested in humane and welfare service, will deliver addresses, and render reports from their representative units. The ways and means of still further aiding the United States army and

navy, the Red Cross, the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, the American Legion, and other recognized national organizations for welfare service, will be a principal factor of discussion at the convention. A special memorial feature is scheduled on the program, at which addresses will be made commemorating the sacrifices of the women who died in the service. A host of girls in uniform, representing the Women's Overseas Service League, will make a pilgrimage to the Great Lakes reservation, to visit and cheer the disabled ex-servicemen who are hospitalized there. They have arranged a dinner and "stunt night" program in honor of the disabled veterans "to remind the boys of the good little times that they had in France, when they were at rest areas after a long period in the trenches." A tea will be given at the Saddle and
