Two Named to Replace Evans

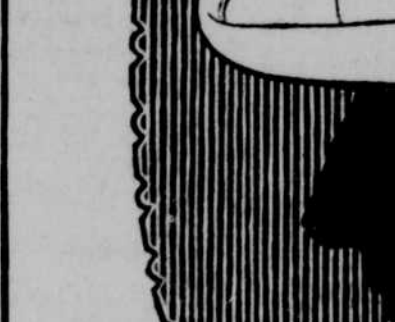

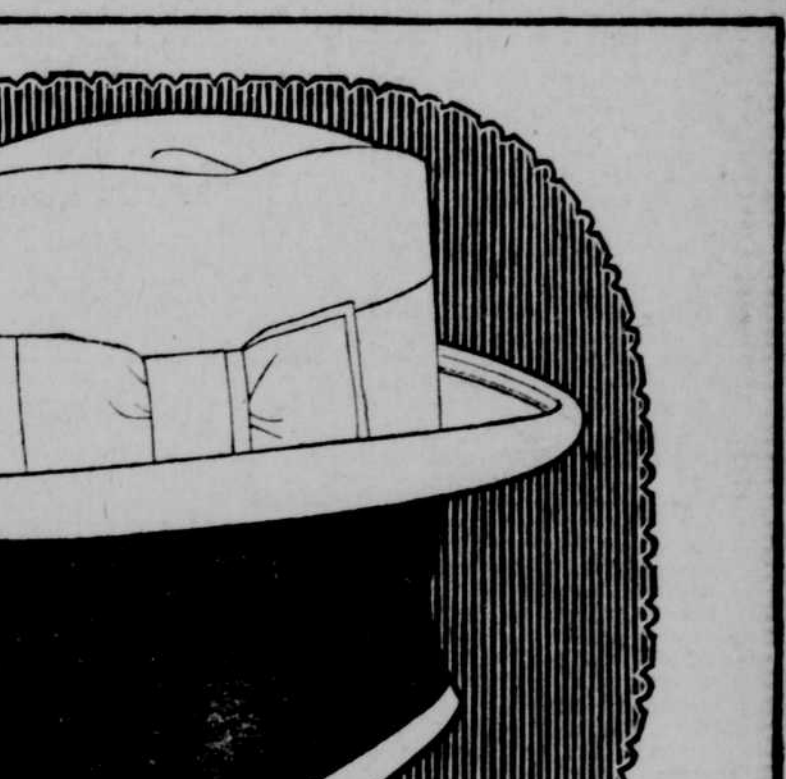
