New Process Records

Piggly Wiggly Head Attacked by Memphis Man

Assault Occurs in Meeting of Committee Appointed to Aid in Sale of Stock.

Memphis, Tenn., May 11.—Clarence Saunders, president of the Piggly Wiggly Stores, Inc., was assaulted by a member of the campaign committee, appointed by the Chamber of Commerce to help Saunders sell 50,000 shares of Piggly Wiggly stock in Memphis. The committee was composed of 40 or 50 members, many of whom had helped Mr. Saunders in his campaign against Wall street.

Yesterday afternoon Saunders emerged from the committee room with a bruised and bleeding cheek and his collar partly torn off. His clothing was badly disarranged. The name of his assailant was kept secret by the committee.

The cause of the altercation is said to have been Mr. Saunders' statement, earlier in the day, in which he said Memphis had failed to buy his stock and that the Piggly stores headquarters would be moved to some city where the stock would be subscribed.

Memphis, Tenn., May 11.—Whether Memphis will retain headquarters of the Piggly Wiggly Stores, Inc., possibly with Clarence Saunders voluntarily retiring as president of the company, or whether the corporation's main office will be moved to some other city, Mr. Saunders retaining control, is expected to be determined largely by a meeting between local banking interests and a committee of the Memphis Chamber of Commerce today.

Troops Start 190-Mile Hike

Fort Omaha and Fort Crook Soldiers Due at Fort Leavenworth May 29.

Two hundred and fifty soldiers from Companies E, F, G, and H, in full marching order, left Fort Omaha at 6 yesterday morning on their hike to Fort Leavenworth a distance of about 190 miles.

They stopped for a brief rest at Hanscom park at 8.

The column was scheduled to arrive at Fort Crook yesterday afternoon at 1. Here it picked up a headquarters company and a band.

The detachments are in command of Maj. Casper Rucker. A reconnaissance party was sent in advance to arrange for camp sites. The hikers are due in Fort Leavenworth May 29. Here they will engage in target practice and will also serve as demonstration troops for the citizens' military training camp there.

They will return to Omaha in September.

Few Coast Lambs Being Shipped

California Stockmen Hard Hit by Drouth, Omaha Stockman Reports.

Bert Roberts, traveling representative of the Omaha Union Stockyards company, who has returned from a trip to the western cattle country and the Pacific coast, reports that very few more California lambs will come east this spring. He says that practically all the lambs will be gone before the first of June.

Sheepmen in California, according to Roberts, were hard hit by the drouth, and the demand of the coast country for meats is good. He does not believe that frozen carcasses shipped through the Panama canal will ever compete seriously for domestic markets.

He says that business is booming on the coast, and that the prospects of the livestock growers are improved.
