Corn planting is going forward rapidly and with favorable weather the 1923 Missouri crop will practically all be in the ground within a few days. An increased acreage is indicated throughout most of the state, except in southeast counties, where cotton and sunflowers are being planted heavily. Corn is coming up to a good stand in Vernon. St. Clair and fields in the Missouri river bottoms. Plowing is 73 per cent finished. Spring sowing and planting is 56 per cent done. Soil is in good condition and being prepared for corn unusually
