

Dry Jury Finds Man Not Guilty Dairy Owner Acquitted on Liquor Charge After Short Trial.

Peter Jensen, 2516 South Forty-second street, dairyman, was acquitted of a charge of illegal possession of liquor after a "dry" jury in District Judge Day's court had deliberated only 15 minutes on his case. Sixty-five men were examined before the shiring 12 were found. The other 53 admitted that they had learned, small or great, toward the cup that cheers, but is now prohibited by law. Jensen appealed his case from police court where he was fined \$100 by Municipal Judge Baldwin. He testified that he sells milk and not booze. Police officers testified that they found a bottle of liquor in his house. The reason for insisting on a dry jury was that at a former trial of a liquor case, the jurors drank up the evidence in the jury room, Prosecutor O'Brien said.

Shelby Named for Omahan.

Scene of Next Pugilistic Classic Namesake of Former Prominent Railroad Man.

Shelby, Mont., scene of the coming heavyweight championship battle between Jack Dempsey and Tommy Gibbons, was named after a former Omahan, according to Matthew J. Greevy. "It was named after Peter Paul Shelby, who started as a day laborer in the Union Pacific shops," said Mr. Greevy. "He rose to be general freight agent of that road and became general manager of the Montana Central lines in the early 80s, when James J. Hill was constructing them. The station called Shelby in honor of Mr. Shelby on the main line between St. Paul and Seattle. Later Mr. Shelby became traffic manager of the entire Great Northern railway." **Sister Lives Here.** "Mrs. John Flanagan, 1729 Park avenue, whose husband is a foreman in the city street department, is a sister of P. P. Shelby. Edward Shelby, formerly of Omaha, now living in California, is a brother." **Margaret Flanagan**, widow of the late Charles E. Flanagan, is a niece of P. P. Shelby. Marty Flanagan, football star, and his three brothers are nephews. "I was closely associated with Mr. Shelby on the west end of the Great Northern railroad during and after its construction, about two years of this time being in his office in Seattle. Sometimes in quiet moods he would have visions of some day when his namesake, Shelby, would become world famous. And now, when the greatest prize fighter the world has yet known is about to defend his title on the Fourth of July, his hope is to become true."
