## **World Court Is** Advocated by Iowa Senator

A. B. Cummins Supports Proposal for United States Membership in Address at Des Moines.

By Associated Press. Des Moines, May 28.-Unqualified approval of the world court under the conditions laid down by President Harding, was voiced today by Senator A. B. Cummins, of Iowa, in an address here before the Conohus club. After an explanation of the provisions for a permanent court of international justice as outlined in article 14 of the league of nations covenant, Senator Cummins declared:

"So far as my personal views are concerned, I have no hestitation in saying that it is my judgment that the United States and every other power should agree to this compulsory

"I have always been ready to submit to any properly constituted international tribunal any controversy of a justifiable character that may arise between the United States and other nations. But it seems to be the long and well established convic tion of the senate, as expressed in nearly all of our arbitration treaties, to make certain exceptions. In harmony with what is known to be the attitude of the senate upon this matter, the proposal of the president that we shall adhere to and support the permanent court of international justice excludes the feature of compulsory jurisdiction.


