

Buffaloes and Denver Bears Split Even in First Double-Header of 1923 Season in Omaha

Grizzlies Score Run in Twelfth of Second Game; Win 3 to 2

OMETHING like 6,500 followers for the first national pastime went out to Fifteenth and Vincent streets Sunday afternoon and saw the Omaha Buffaloes and Denver Bears split even in the first bargain-day attraction of the season for this village. The herd won the first game, 8 to 4, but dropped the second in the first of the 12th when the Grizzlies scored the run that broke a 2 to 2 tie, winning the contest, 3 to 2.

In the first exhibition the Buffaloes treated two Denver pitchers rather roughly. Ted Campbell, former Buffalo, didn't last long on the mound. He got hit for three runs. He was added to this, Ted was pretty wild. He gave up the task in the second and the designated Hall took up the mound duty. Hall wasn't as wild as Odenwald, but he was nickered quite frequently by the Buffaloes. Hall coughed up 12 hits, among them being three home runs.

Speedy Odenwald Omaha on the hill and wobbed a couple of times. He wobbled in the second and third innings when the Bears scored two runs in each frame, but after the third game straightened up and hurled dandy ball. He allowed the Grizzlies nine hits and walked only two visitors. Omaha scored one in the first and then three more in the second. The Grizzlies counted two in the second and then tied things up in the third, only to have the Buffaloes score two runs in that half of the same inning. From the third until the end of the herd held the lead.

The second contest was the real bargain attraction. The fans got plenty baseball for their money all afternoon, but in the second game the Buffaloes and Bears chased each other for 12 innings before they were able to determine a winner. The final score was 3 to 2, but that's only half the story.

Welter Kavoes Firpo's Ring Foe

By Associated Press. Havana, May 30.—The boxing bout between Luis Angel Firpo, the South American heavyweight, and Joe White of New York, which had been arranged for Sunday, has been called off.

Yesterday afternoon, during a sparring match with Estanislao Cerna, a Cuban colored welterweight, White was twice knocked out by the lighter man with 12-counce gloves.

The crowd which was witnessing the training bout made a noisy demonstration and it was necessary for the police to clear the arena. The Cuban boxing commission, three members of which were at the ringside, immediately convened and reached a decision disqualifying White as an unfit opponent of Firpo.

Neither group of fight enthusiasts congregated outside of the arena, where the boxers have been training, and demanded that the promoters of the bout substitute Antonio Fierro, Cuban heavyweight champion, as Firpo's opponent Sunday afternoon.

Crooks Flock to Shelby. Great Falls, Mont., May 30.—A corps of special officers of the Great Northern Railway company, augmented by operatives from the principal cities of the west, will be on duty in Shelby before and during the fight July 4 of Jack Dempsey, heavyweight champion of the world, and Tommy Gibbons, who was announced here today by officials of that road.

Safety precautions already will be taken by the Great Northern and the presence of guards at all crossings has been arranged for every hour of the day. In the event of accidents or illness, a medical staff will be on hand to take care of emergency cases. Sanitary arrangements will be supervised by the state board of health.

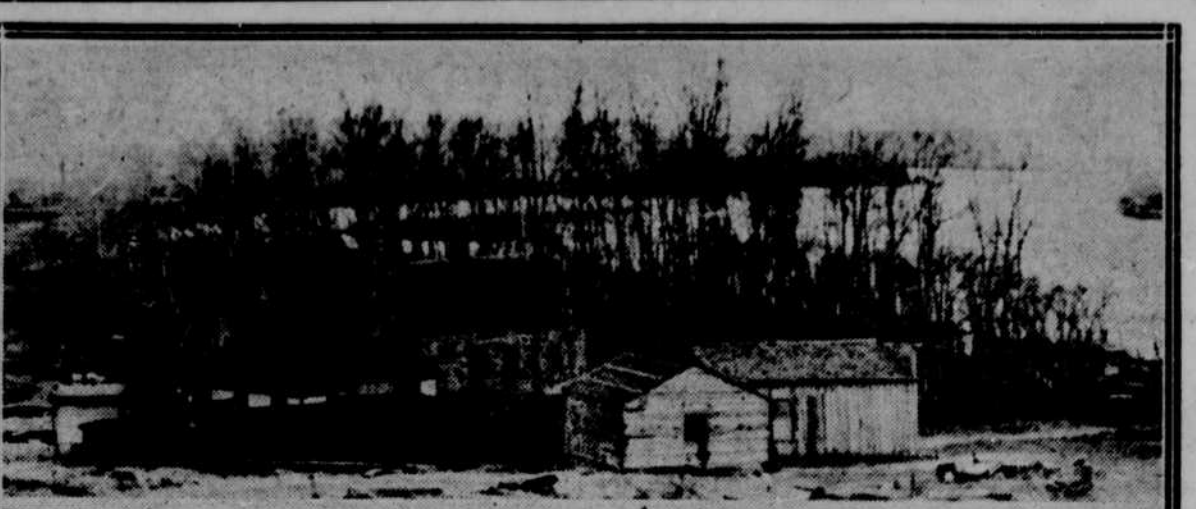

Two solid smashes by Lew Harley of New York lurled his right ear hanging by a shred. Harley refused to fight with the referee, who refused to realize the seriousness of his injury.
