Expect Large Entry List for Annual Women's Golf Tourney

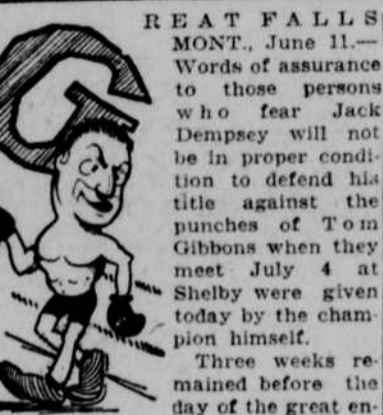
