

U. S. Has Lived Within Income for Past Year

President Addresses Business Organizations of Government—Plans Formed to Cut Expenditure.

By International News Service. Washington, June 18.—In laboring faithfully to reduce the cost of government the department heads and bureau chiefs who are the "trustees of the taxpayers" are doing more "proving to the world" that they are recovering from war excesses...

This was the message that President Harding delivered this afternoon to the business organizations of the government assembled in the Continental Memorial hall for the annual review of past achievements and to plan new ways of cutting down expenditures during the fiscal year which begins July 1.

In taking stock of what has been accomplished during the last year, the president pointed out that an apparent deficit of \$32,000,000 had been turned into a surplus of approximately \$20,000,000, and urged similar or further economies to wipe out the deficit of \$30,000,000 which looms up for the fiscal year 1934.

Explains Saving. In explanation that the \$20,000,000 surplus was affected this year in the face of an apparent deficit, General Lord said: "We began this year with an expenditure program of \$3,396,000,000.

Most of the credit for the government's saving record, Lord said, is given to extraordinary increases in receipts, especially customs. Actual expenditures from capital funds are many millions less than were earlier estimated.

Doctor Arraigned on Murder Charge

C. L. Egbert Pleads "Not Guilty" of Killing Son-in-Law—Case Continued.

S. P. Control of C. P.'s Upheld

Consolidation Authorized in 1920 Transportation Act Found Valid.

By Associated Press. St. Paul, Minn., June 18.—Railway consolidation and control by stock ownership and lease as authorized by the transportation act of 1920 are held valid in a decree of the federal circuit court of appeals decided on here today in the Southern Pacific Central Pacific case.

The form of the decree upholding the interstate commerce commission's order authorizing the Southern Pacific to control the Central Pacific by lease and stock ownership was agreed upon after arguments by counsel for the commission's order on the ground that the United States supreme court had issued a mandate for dissolution of the two lines as in violation of the Sherman anti-trust law.

The case, it was stated, undoubtedly will be referred to the United States supreme court, and a final decision is admitted of major importance in that the force of the consolidation provisions of the transportation act will be determined.

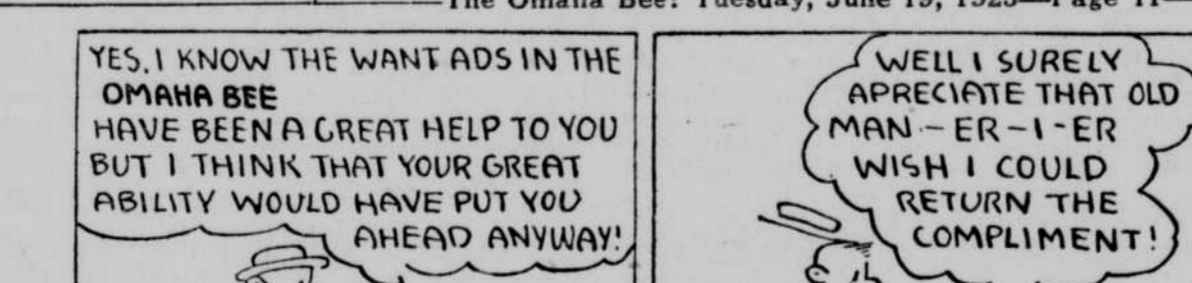
