

Canada Refuses to Aid in Keeping Liquor From U. S.

Suggestion to Halt Clearance of Rum Ships for American Ports Meets With Rebuff.

Washington, June 22.—The Canadian government has informed the State department, through a note from the British ambassador here, of its inability to adopt the suggestion put forward by the department last March that clearance papers be delivered to vessels with cargoes of liquor destined to ports in the United States, unless a permit authorizing its importation was presented.
