

One Good and One Hard Game Is Sunday's Baseball Menu With Omaha Taking Better of Two

HE only good feature of Sunday's doubleheader between the Buffaloes and Tulsa Oilers was the first game of the bargain-day attraction which drew home boys won by the score of 5 to 2.

Manila Promoters After Pancho Villa

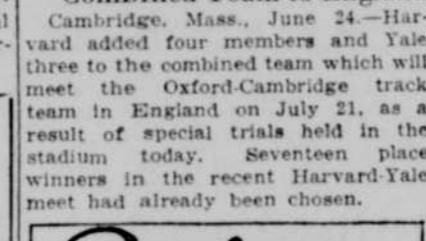
