

# Davis' Ouster Will Be Probed by Congress

## Reclamation Service to Come Under Scrutiny When Six-State Treaty Is Presented.

Washington, June 26.—The entire reclamation program of the United States is expected to come under congressional scrutiny in the next session because of the ouster of Arthur Powell Davis as head of the reclamation service. The congressional investigation is expected to result from the presentation to congress of the six-state treaty negotiated by Herbert Hoover, secretary of commerce, involving California, Utah, Nevada, Colorado, New Mexico, and Arizona.

This pact, which arranges for the distribution of power and water from Colorado river, must be approved by congress. The removal of Davis is believed by his supporters to have been motivated because of his insistence that the government and not private parties should develop Colorado river projects.

Secretary Work's office intimates Davis was dismissed because he was too insistent upon receiving payments from settlers on irrigation projects who have been going through some hard times, along with the rest of the farming community. Davis takes the position that if payments are not kept up the revolving fund for the continuation of reclamation projects will become exhausted and that congress will refuse to appropriate more money.

Arriving in Salt Lake about noon, the president was greeted by school children in Liberty park after a tour of the business district and then went to a hotel where he shook hands with approximately 3,000 persons at a public reception.

Later a call was received from the Holloway home, after Earl Dove discovered his sister dead. Police connected the two slayings. Commissioner Butler personally took charge of the case.

Fraeger was taken to Swedish Mission hospital where he died shortly afterward. The body of Mrs. Holloway was taken to the Duffy & Johnson undertaking establishment.

George Norgard, 1405 Ohio street, a neighbor of Fraeger, from whom he bought his home, told police that Fraeger Monday night asked him to "look after my chickens tomorrow, because I am either going to be dead or in jail."

Said to Have Drowned. Fraeger is said to have a daughter, Mabel Hirsch, living in the vicinity of Twenty-fifth and Cumings streets, and a niece, Marlan Bacon, living in the same neighborhood, as well as two stepsons, Roy Dewell and William Dowell, living near Fourteenth and Fowler.
