Schools to Help Americanize Omahans Will Open July 2. Complying with the request of the education committee of the Omaha Council of Americanization, the board of education has arranged to open schools for foreign-born men and women, beginning Monday, July 2.

The following public school buildings will be utilized: Monday, Brown Park; Tuesday, Comenius; Wednesday, South Franklin; Thursday, Kelton; and Friday, West Side.

The schools will be open in the afternoon from 2 to 3:30, and will be in charge of Miss Marie Matthews. Subjects will include the speaking, reading and writing of English.
