

### Bryan Reception Campaign Feeler

#### Political Pot Begins to Simmer - Wet and Dry Coalition to Be Sought.

(Special Dispatch to The Omaha Bee.) Lincoln, July 6.—All political eyes are centered this week upon a public reception to be given Saturday night at the governor's mansion to democratic political leaders in the state. Not only will Governor Bryan be there, but his distinguished brother, William Jennings Bryan, three times candidate for president and looked upon by many as willing to make the sacrifice a fourth time, will be on the receiving line. There, in the advantageous position of hosts, it is confidently predicted that the Bryan brothers will do everything possible to gain consent of party leaders to follow the Bryan banner in the pending pre-convention fight. At the present time William Jennings Bryan has expressed a liking for the McAdoo candidacy. Whether the brothers will openly attempt a union of democrats behind the McAdoo banner or will be content to sound out sentiment for candidates and let that suffice for a time, is problematical.

**Fly in Ointment.** There is one fly admittedly in the ointment at this time in the person of Governor Al Smith of New York. It is known every effort is being made by Governor Bryan to keep the wet democrats, already organizing Smith-for-president clubs in Nebraska, in line with the Bryan standard.

To accomplish this purpose, Governor Bryan has absolutely refused to be quoted on Governor Smith's action in signing the prohibition repealer in New York. He also has handed out prize political appointments to the liberal element in democratic ranks.

To gain the friendship of the wet element the governor has been obliged openly to fight the officers of the Antislavery league and mutterings of a "double cross" by the governor are heard daily in prohibition ranks. Despite the governor's opposition the same officers of the Antislavery league who fought him in the election because of his tieup with Senator Hitchcock were re-elected recently by the league.

With both of these elements being urged to attend the democratic reception and every effort being made to impress upon them the need of a united democracy, which, incidentally must be led by the Bryans, the meeting here Saturday night promises to be interesting.

Senator Hitchcock is in Atlantic City and his regrets have been received. The question is whether such democrats as James C. Dahlgren, J. N. Norton, Theodore Osterman, Dan Butler and Arthur Mullen are willing to gather round the governor's festive board and boost whatever the Bryan plans for the coming presidential and senatorial campaign may be.

Coroner Cutler declared that Beeson probably removed the clip and started to clean the gun, forgetting about the cartridge which remained in the barrel. The dead man's widow and daughter are in McAllen, Tex. He is survived also by his mother, Mrs. C. E. Thornton; a brother, W. L. Thornton; three half-brothers, Floyd Thornton, Ora Thornton and J. P. Thornton, and two half-sisters, Mrs. Mabel Hayden of Council Bluffs and Mrs. Lela Creager of Otoe, Ia. Beeson formerly was a member of the J. W. Squire real estate firm.

#### Two Dead From Auto Accidents, One Drowning on Fourth.

Special Dispatch to The Omaha Bee. Des Moines, Ia., July 6.—Three deaths and nearly 100 injuries are results of Iowa Fourth of July celebrations.

Milo McKibbin, Jessup, Ia., was killed when an interurban train crashed into an automobile at a grade crossing. Four other occupants of the machine were injured and were taken to a hospital.

George D. Holmes, 23, Avery, Ia., was drowned in the Chariton river. He fainted and fell in, according to members of the party. E. F. McQueen, 31, of Locust Grove was almost instantly killed when his neck was broken in an automobile accident at a crossroads. His wife, two children and mother-in-law were not seriously injured though their car rolled over three times.
