

Gary to Abolish 12-Hour Steel Day in Near Future

Influx of Laborers From Canada and South to Make Shorter Hours Possible Soon.

New York, July 6.—Influx into northern industrial centers of negroes from the south and laborers from Mexico, the Philippines, Canada and a few European countries, soon will make possible the abolishment of the 12-hour day in the steel industry, Elbert H. Gary, chairman of the board of the United States Steel corporation, announced today.

Mr. Gary's announcement followed action of President Harding making public Thursday before sailing for Alaska, correspondence between the president and directors of the American Iron and Steel institute, in which the latter pledged themselves to abolish the long day when a sufficient labor supply was assured.

Mr. Gary estimated that the change would require 60,000 additional laborers and would increase the cost of finished steel products by 15 per cent. The decision of the leaders to do away with the long day, Mr. Gary said, was made in recognition of the growing public sentiment in favor of such a step and in recognition of the president's attitude.

Ak Plans to Hold Stock Shows Here Organization Would Make Omaha Center of Fine Dairy Exhibits.

'Plans are being worked out by directors of Ak-Sar-Ben by which in future years Omaha will become a center for fine stock shows. A dairy show may be held at Ak-Sar-Ben field next year. There are no facilities for one this fall, members of the agricultural committee of the Omaha Chamber of Commerce learned at a meeting yesterday.

Charles A. Black informed the committee that it was the intention to erect hog, cattle and sheep barns at Ak-Sar-Ben field as soon as circumstances permitted. These would be designed for the holding of fine stock shows, not to compete with the state fair, but to attract exhibitors that would do no come to Nebraska.

W. D. Harford and Charles Gardner, who also appeared for Ak-Sar-Ben, regretted that there was no possibility, with the air mail landing field occupying so much of the space, of housing a dairy show this fall. When the government lease expires and the landing place is moved to Fort Crook, then plans for the development of the field will be ready.

Data Given Artificer on Ak-Sar-Ben Floats Historical data for 23 floats representing events in American history, which are to be used in the Ak-Sar-Ben pageant, have been delivered to Gus Rands, artificer of the Ak-Sar-Ben carnival, by John Lee Webster, who is planning the pageant.

The floats are to form a great historical sequence portraying American history from the opening of the revolution to the present time. Each float will be drawn by four horses in white and led by men dressed in the costume of the time represented by the float. In a few days colored sketches of the floats, drawn by Mr. Rands, will be in Mr. Webster's office on display to members of organizations which consider taking a float. A few sketches have already been received.

The floats will be constructed in the balloon building at Fort Omaha. A troop of cavalry and one of artillery have been promised for the parade by Maj. Gen. George B. Duncan.
