

Food Tablets to Turn Stoves Into Relics

Such Is Prediction of Surgeon General of Public Health Service—Dish Washing to Pass.

Washington, July 10.—Concentrated food tablets, so small that they may be balanced on the tip of the tongue, may yet supersede the weighty viands which now sustain man at the price of an enormous amount of kitchen drudgery.

This opinion was expressed by Surgeon General Hugh S. Cumming of the United States Public Health Service. However, he backed on a reservation or so.

"Personally, I like to eat," he declared. "There is nothing more pleasing to my gastronomic structure than to gaze upon a table well set with plentiful food. Palate tickling through the eye, which sets the gastric juice flowing, is held to be a great aid to digestion."

"On the other hand, it may come day be possible to sit down to a table full of dishes beautifully done in wax, swallow a pill and get away with it. My grandfather, who died in 1909 at 93, used to say he considered nothing impossible in this wonderful age, and that if it were said man would yet fly, he would not dispute it."

Senator Borah Defends Harding's World Court Plan. Boole, Ida., July 10.—United States Senator William E. Borah, republican of Idaho, came to the defense of President Harding in a reply to United States Senator William H. King, democrat of Utah, who last Saturday, in a speech at Salt Lake City, called the nation's chief executive "insincere" and declared that in his advocacy of the world court, the president "had deceived the people."

In a statement made public here yesterday, Senator Borah asserted Senator King's "deep and abiding affection" for the republic of nations may be "unconsciously colored his judgment" and declared:

"I feel that the president has pointed the way for the creation of an effective international judicial tribunal instead of weakening the court. His purpose, if realized, will strengthen the tribunal and make it far more effective and useful in the cause of peace."

Woman Named Under Dry Act Loses First Round in Court. Denver, July 10.—Mrs. Katherine O'Connor, Denver society woman, indicted by a federal grand jury on charges of conspiring to violate the Volstead act, lost the first round of her battle for vindication in the United States district court here, when Judge J. Foster Symes overruled a demurrer to the indictment filed by her attorney. The case now will go to trial as soon as it can be placed on the calendar.

Goldfield Cabin Burns After Explosion of Still. Reno, Nev., July 10.—The explosion of a still resulted in the destruction of a cabin in Goldfield by fire yesterday according to reports received here tonight. The blaze was placed under control before much damage was done.
