Severe Quake Under Pacific

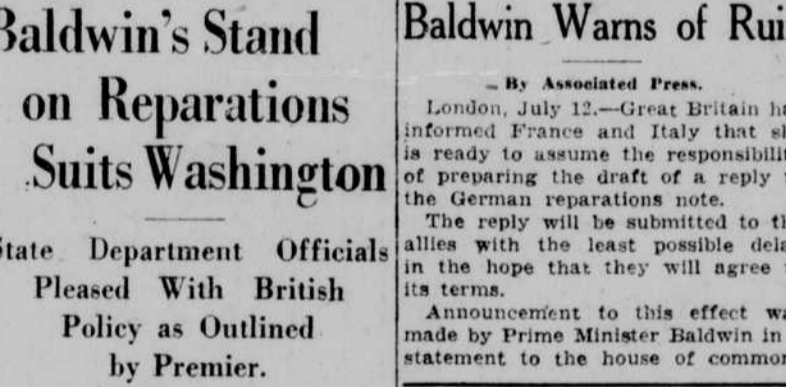

The first of the commodities to be taken up will be magnesium, an investigation of which was ordered by the commission today.

Great Britain Suggests Joint Action in Canada

Washington, July 12.—Joint action by the powers is understood to have been suggested by Great Britain as a means of restoring normal conditions along the Chinese sea coast and up the great rivers upon which the export cities are located.

U. S. Air Forces to Practice Along West Coast, in Hawaii

Washington, July 12.—Distribution of air squadrons attached to the battle fleet to points along the Pacific coast and in Hawaii for summer practice, has been ordered by the Navy department with a view to enabling the units to acquaint themselves thoroughly with the topography of those areas while the fleet is idle.

Elks Approve Plans for New Headquarters

Atlanta, Ga., July 12.—With the approval of the grand lodge of the Benevolent Protective Order of Elks, contracts for the construction of the new memorial headquarters building proposed in Chicago will be let within two weeks. The full measure of the building of the commission in charge of the construction of the new headquarters building will cost approximately \$2,000,000 and work is expected to be started this year, the report said.
