It is even more ominous that this un lawful assault on the commerce of the nation should have found apologists and defendants, including some (happily, few) of those charged with the duty of protecting property and enforcing the law.

"This strike was more than a controversy between employer and em-Its manifest purpose, as shown by the evidence, was to cripple and destroy interstate commerce, and to create by this assault a public opinion hostile to the decision of the board. The primary purpose of the combination therefore is unlawful, and it may not be carried out by means that otherwise would be legal "Even if the strike is regarded merely as a controversy between em ployer and employe, the evidence shows beyond doubt that it was part of the purpose of those engaged in this combination to carry on the strike by assaults and acts of violence. Certainly upon such a show ng the injunctive relief will not be limited to forbidding acts of violence which are done in secret, and for which it is hard to fix responsibility and to impose punishment, and thus leave defendants free to encourage injury to persons and property by open words and deeds which in themselves
