

Pageant Art Is Needed to Curb Loose Morals

Rededication to Principles of America Necessary for Protection, Woman Writer Declares.

The pageant, "Patriotic Historic America," to be given during the Ak-Sar-Ben carnival in October under the direction of John Lee Webster, whose vast knowledge of the subject most ably fits him for the task, is a much-needed lesson for those of all ages. Mr. Webster announces that its aim is, as Lincoln said, to "rededicate ourselves" to the cause and to the country for which our forefathers suffered and died. It should arouse an appreciation of the magnificent opportunities and advantages their work has given us, instead of a disposition to see only the few minor faults which some people are prone to emphasize. The need for history study in the schools has always been recognized, but the world now demands things on a vaster scale.

If each generation had to learn everything for itself, the world would never have gotten beyond barbarism. The more we learn of what has gone before, of the experiments, mistakes, failures and successes, the better equipped are we to judge wisely and act successfully in bringing forth happy conditions to ourselves, our nation and the world. Most of the thinkers of the country believe there is too much bolshevist tendency among us. With the upheaval in the rest of the world, it would be a miracle if we were not badly tainted with lawlessness, and it is only by holding steadfastly and constantly "rededicating ourselves" to the foundation principles of Americanism, that we can protect ourselves from pollution and be a beacon light to other countries.

Factions Not Considered.
Mr. Webster has pointed out that the founders of our government were great and their work enduring because they considered the good of all, favoring no faction and no locality, and that the names of those who opposed them by trying to further personal interests, have been buried in oblivion.

Charles Fillmore, founder and head of the Unity Society of Christianity in Kansas City, probably the strongest and most successful expounders of universal kindness, has started the big movement for the use of the golden rule in business which is sweeping the country, teaching and proving that it makes vastly more money for everybody. He says: "If I had been writing the Declaration of Independence, I think that I would have written it just as it is." He also quotes this:

Favor Golden Rule.
"The Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce appointed an industrial relations committee to look into the question of industrial unrest, determine what caused it and suggest a remedy. The committee came to the conclusion that basically it was caused by a too prevalent spirit of greediness and suspicion. The remedy suggested by the committee, enthusiastically endorsed by the Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce, was the recognition of the Golden Rule in its best and highest sense."

"Attention was directed to the fact that the success of our forefathers in establishing a republic in this country was due to the fact that they were inspired by a spirit of service and unselfishness and looked to Divine providence for inspiration and leadership. United States Senator George Wharton Pepper, in speaking to the group of 50 business men of Philadelphia, who later adopted what is known as the Golden Rule pledge, stated that labor and capital could not be reconciled by any of the mechanical methods which trusted in force, but that 'we must go back to God.' The pledge was adopted by the chamber, is receiving endorsement by similar bodies and is being enthusiastically promoted by Philadelphia men."

The constitutional convention, meeting in the same city, seemed doomed to failure until Franklin said, "Unless

the Lord build the house, they labor in vain that build it," and caused each session to be opened with prayer. United States Senator Medill McCormick of Illinois, in a recent article in the Saturday Evening Post, on his investigations in Europe, said that there is nothing that can save Europe and the world from destruction but a return to the principles of Jesus Christ.

Obviously Nebraska must soon choose between spending money for art, music and education, or for many more penal institutions and increased police protection. A few spectacular man hunts or the maintenance and guarding of several life-termsers surely cost as much as all of this pageant. As we study as much as possible the

examples set us by those who have wrought and built upon a solid rock, so may we do likewise. For such a purpose the panorama "Patriotic Historic America" will be the most magnificent object lesson imaginable.

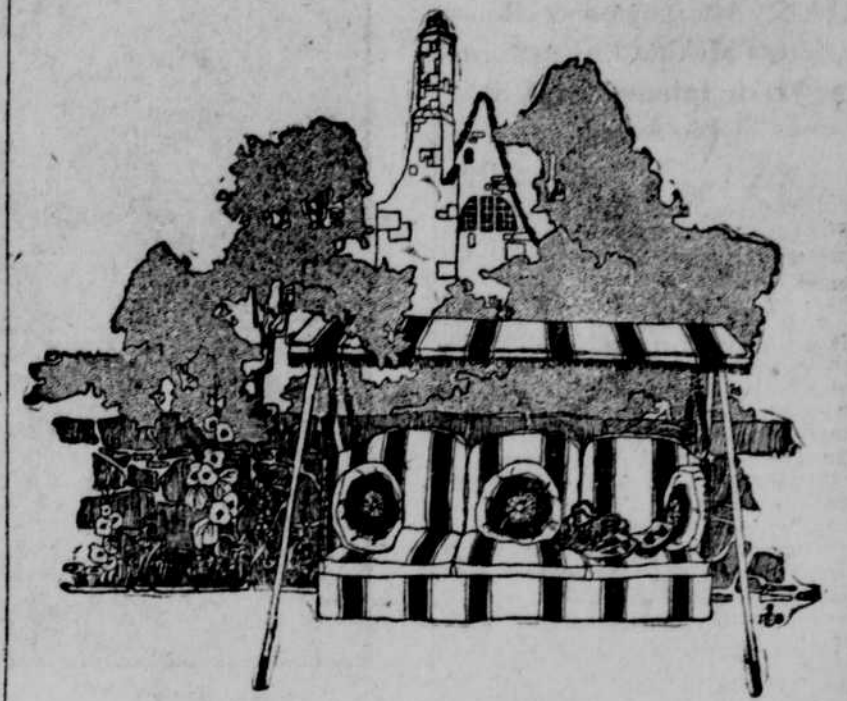
