Mr. Websted announces that its aim is, as Lincoln, said, to "rededicate ourselves" to the cause and to the country for which our forefathers suffered and died. It should arouse an appreciation of the magnificent opportunities and advantages their work has given us, instead of a disposition to see only the few minor faults which some people are prone to emphasize. The need for history study in the schools has always been recognized, but the world now demands things on a vaster

If each generation had to learn everything for itself, the world would never have gotten beyond barbarism. Favor Golden Rule. "The Philadelphia Chamber of Com merce appointed an industrial relations committee to look into the question of industrial unrest, determine what caused it and suggest a remedy. The remedy suggested by the committe, enthusiastically endorsed by the Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce, was the recognition of the Golden Rule in its best and highest sense.

"Attention was directed to the fact that the success of our forefathers in establishing a republic in this country was due to the fact that they were inspired by a spirit of service and unselfishness and looked to Divine providence for inspiration and leadership. United States Schator George Wharton Pepper, in speaking to the group of 850 business men of Philadelphia, who later adopted what is known as the Golden Rule pledge, stated that labor and capital could not be reconciled by any of the mechanical methods which trusted in force. but that 'we must go back to God.' 
