Accord ingly, he organized the Brothers of David in September of 1921.

Wolf Cubs, like boy scouts, are arranged in three distinct classes, tenderpads, first star cubs and second star cubs. Graduation from one class to another may be accomplished only by passing certain set tests, similar to, but easier than, those required of the boy scout.

Merit Badges Awarded.

After attaining the rank of a second star cub, the lad may set about acquiring proficiency badges, the cquivalent of the boy scout merit badges, by passing more rigid tests on the varied subjects for which the badges are offered. These include collecting (stamps, insects, etc.), signalling, observing, weaving, drawing, wood-working, first aid, tidying a house, guiding, swimming, team playing and athletics,

There are now 50 Wolf Cubs in Omaha, composing five packs. They have a temporary summer camp in the Florence woods on grounds provided through the courtesy of Byron R. Hastings, Omaha real estate man, who is a member of the advisory board of the organization.

The cubs spend every weekend at the camp, \$1 to defray food expenses being the only charge. The program and management of the camp is much the same as that of the scout camp at Gifford. The camp is supervised by a health inspector, camp director and a steward to do the cooking. Religious services are conducted at the camp Sundays.


