

Endres Advises His Deputies on Proper Conduct

Avoid Embarrassment by Not Wearing Lodge Insignia, One of Sheriff's Rules.

If a deputy sheriff happens to be a cyclops of the Ku Klux Klan, or if he is a member of the Sons and Daughters of I Will Arise, it behooves him not to wear his lodge pin when making raids. He might meet the grand exalted commander, or a fellow might wave the sign of a brother in distress.

This admonition is contained in a set of six rules distributed by Sheriff Mike Endres to all his deputies.

The list of rules follows:

1. In receiving insane federal, state or county prisoners, it is not the place of the deputies to discuss prisoners' cases, as to whether or not they are guilty. This is entirely a matter for the court to decide.
2. The sheriff does not think it advisable for any of the deputies to be involved in any case as to be wanted as a witness, as in such case the deputy might have to testify against the state, which would come with very bad grace for the reason that we are all state officers.
3. The sheriff does not think it advisable for turnkeys to get too friendly with men or women prisoners in their charge, or enter into their private affairs, or give them personal opinions of their cases. While we aim to treat them courteously and with respect, yet, it is unwise to be too sympathetic.
4. Any news to be given to newspapers or for publication should not be given out by deputies or jailer, but should be taken up entirely with the sheriff as he is the one who will be criticized for any action of any of those under his charge. If it is good news, tell his chief.
5. The sheriff believes it inadvisable for any deputies making raids or investigations, to wear any fraternal badges or pins or insignia of any kind which might put them under an obligation in the event they run across fellow lodge members, etc.
6. Any deputy making an arrest must not use his "sap" or other weapons except in most urgent cases of self defense. In transferring prisoners to Lincoln, Norfolk or the penitentiary, they must be handcuffed for their own protection and for the protection of the public. Boys taken to the reformatory, if over 21 years of age, must be handcuffed. In taking prisoners to the asylum for the insane, we must show them all respect in keeping with the safety of such patients.

"It will be no bother at all," replied Peter quickly. "I would love to do it."

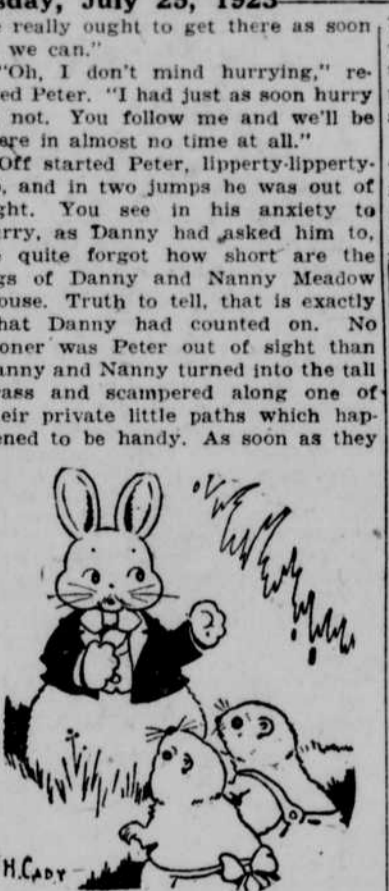
Danny winked at Nanny. "How far is it to one of those places you have in mind, Peter?" he asked.

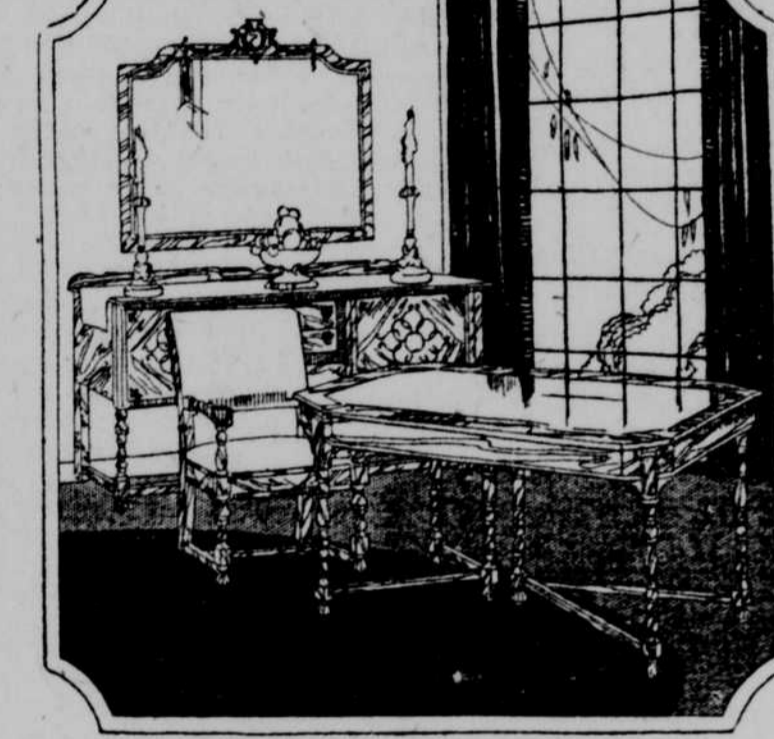

The Power Is On

From the huge gray bulk of the cement plant's buildings come the whir of belts, the rattle of conveyors, the clatter of tumbling rock, the din of great machines.

In the kiln house there is a steady roar from the great revolving steel kilns as their 30-foot tongue of flame licks up the fuel.
