

New International History Museum Sought at Capital
 Washington, July 28.—The International Historical Museum association, believing the day of international co-operation has come to stay, and that it is privilege and duty of America to take a leading part, proposes to erect a museum to make such co-operation possible, by basing it upon a permanent foundation of

international understanding and good will.
 The proposed International Historical museum will provide a non-political meeting ground for all civilized nations, where the historical background of all peoples of the world may be set forth by historical galleries of art illustrating the development, culture and aspirations of each nation. By mural paintings, sculpture, mementos, portraits, pan-

oramas, memorials, trophies, relics, and records each nation will exemplify its life history, achievements, great men and great accomplishments which have contributed to the advancement of civilization, the liberation and amelioration of mankind, and the promotion of his higher interests.
 Galleries will be permanently allocated to the participating nations, thus making a permanent historical

exhibit made beautiful by means of the fine arts, and possessing a historical and an educational value of the highest order.
 The central building, or international memorial hall, for which a site near the new Memorial bridge, will be asked of congress, will contain exhibits of international significance in the minds of mankind, as well as afford a meeting room for international gatherings.

American Tourists Discover Charms of Rio de Janeiro
 Rio de Janeiro, July 25.—Never in any previous year has Rio de Janeiro had as many North American visitors as in the last six months. In addition to full passenger lists on the regular steamers from New York, there have been several special tourist steamers in port.
 In previous years almost all North

Americans coming to Brazil were on business missions, whereas this year the majority have been sightseers. Visitors of this kind from other countries are extremely few, compared to the North Americans.
 The centennial exposition, which undoubtedly was the magnet attracting the tourists, has occupied but little of their time. After a few hurried visits to the exposition grounds, the visitors have given their attention to

the city's many other attractions. Judging from their conversations while here in the years to follow there will be many North American tourists in Brazil who previously had spent their leisure time in Europe.
 Although the state of siege, originally decreed at the time of the military revolt last July, is still in effect, there is nothing to indicate this fact to the visitor, and he goes on his way without interference of any kind un-

less one of his cablegrams happens to be held up by the censor.
