

America Granted Right of Straits at Lausanne Meet

United States Will Receive All Privileges Without Signing Convention With Turkish Government.

Lausanne, July 28.—The American Turkish experts reached an agreement tonight, whereby the United States receives the most favored nation treatment concerning the freedom of the straits for merchantmen and warships. The United States, without signing the straits convention, will receive all privileges. Also it will be restricted by all limitations imposed by that convention, which gives each signatory the right to maintain their ships, not exceeding 10,000 tons each, in the straits. There is a substituting privilege, that each power may have as many ships there as are possessed by any country bordering on the Black sea. This, of course, includes Russia, which has decided to adhere to the straits treaty.
