

Victims Die in Autos in 2 Accidents

All Members of 3 Illinois Families—5 Killed When Car Struck by Electric Train.

By International News Service. Chicago, Aug. 7.—Ten persons are dead today and four others are suffering serious injuries as a result of automobile crashes at grade crossings late last night and early this morning.

All of the dead and injured are members of three families. The dead: George B. Walup, private secretary to G. E. Patterson, general superintendent of the Illinois Central rail road; Mrs. Julia Walup, his wife; George Walup, Jr., 18, their son; W. G. Walup, father of Mr. Walup; Mrs. Anna Walup, George Walup's mother; O. L. Kendall, Kingsville, O.; Robert Kendall, 9, his son; Dorothy Kendall, Kingsville, O.; Charles Spalding, Kingsville, O.; and Lola Spalding, 15, his daughter.

The car in which the Kendall and Spalding families were en route to visit a friend was wrecked by a coal car which backed down a grade crossing at Griffith, Ill., early today. Four additional members of the two families were injured and are in a hospital at Griffith.

The Walups were killed when the car in which they were motoring was demolished by an Illinois Traction system electric train at a crossing at Girard, Ill., late last night.

Wreckage of the car was hurled 300 feet.
