The decision of the socialist caucus to join with the communists to force the downfall of the Cuno government brought the chancellor to insist upon the acceptance of his resignation by Ebert. It was declared Saturday that the Chancellor had tendered his resignation to the president who had re fused to accept it. Only a dramatic change in the

perilous situation can make it possible now for Dr. Cuno to continue as the leader in Germany. With the socialists demanding three

seats in the cabinet, the retiring chancellor may, for the sake of public saftey, remain in charge of his office until the new cabinet is completed. The party leaders are in continuou session with Dr. Stresemann
