Jack Dempsey Takes First Workout Since Shelby Bout

Champion Heavyweight Mauler Starts Preparation for Title Fight With Luis Firpo in New York September 14—Works With Joe Benjamin.

By DAMON RUNYON. Universal Service Staff. Saratoga, N. Y., Aug. 13.—They now have Jack Dempsey neatly fenced in at Luther's White Sulphur Springs. Sunday morning Dempsey was up bright and early and with Remy Doran, Kearns went out to the McGregor links and played a round of golf.

Benjamin, who came here expecting to work with Dempsey right along, will leave in a few days for Los Angeles, where he is booked to box Phil Salvatore in a four-rounder. He will return east before the Dempsey-Firpo fight.

Kearns is going to New York tonight to see Tex Rickard and transact other business. Luther's is taking on a pugilist aspect. Remy Doran, manager of Charley White, the Chicago lightweight, arrived last night to spend a day at the place he discovered as a training camp. Years ago Doran had Frank Moran trained at Luther's building, the same pavilion that Dempsey is using.

Floyd Johnson, the Iowa heavyweight, motored up from New York with Johnny Dempsey, brother of the champion, and Johnny Johnson, his own brother. Floyd expects to spend several days at White Sulphur, where he trained for his fight with Jack McAuliffe, II, and may do some boxing with the champion.

Pancho Villa, the flyweight champion, has been working at Luther's for some time. It is said Dempsey wanted Villa to box with him, but the Filipino is not doing any boxing just at present.

He tried his speed against Jack in the first round today, but Dempsey seemed to have even more "foot," as the racing men would say, than Jose Jones-Updike Stable Arrives From Aurora.
