Chicago, Aug. 13.—Executives of
western railroads, after a conference
with an Omaha committee of business
men who have been urging a 25 per
cent reduction in freight rates on
wheat and flour for export, agreed
to seek further information on the
subject before making a final decision.
It was learned late today after the
session broke up.

Members of the Omaha committee
would not discuss the conference and
no formal statement was issued. The
visiting committee members left the
conference place without comment
on what additional argument they
had advanced for a rate reduction
on wheat and flour exports which
they sought of the western executives
in a recent meeting decided
against the proposal.

No Action Taken.
When the railroad chiefs emerged,
Mr. Gorman said that no action had
been taken but that there was a

heads would seek more information
and that it might result in a communication
to Mr. Kennedy.

The nature of this was not
made known outside the conference,
but the Omaha men were heard and
after they left the meeting the rail
executives remained in session about
20 minutes in discussion.
