

Omahans Will Leave for Yankton Tuesday

Omaha business men will leave at 10 tonight for Yankton, S. D., and a short tour of that state to get acquainted.

More prominent men will make this tour than ever before on a trade excursion, according to officers of the Chamber of Commerce.

United States National bank; F. H. Davis, president of the First National bank; T. C. Byrne of Byrne-Hammer, and David Cole of the King Cole company will be among those who will help greet the South Dakota neighbors.

"We feel it will be one of the most important trips ever taken," said W. A. Ellis, acting secretary of the Chamber of Commerce. "We will be the guests of honor at the dedication of the Yankton bridge, which will

Child, Hurt, Wins Hearts of Police

Still able to smile, despite several painful cuts about her head and face, Pretty Ruby Frahm, 6, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. H. H. Frahm, won the hearts of Central police station attendants Monday morning when she was taken there for treatment.

The little girl was riding in the front seat of an automobile driven by her father when the car was struck by Harney street car No. 1032 at Eleventh and Harney streets. The flying glass cut her cheek and forehead.

She probably received more attention than any injured person ever received at Central station. Hangers on at the police court showered her with coins, and three police officers, Kinyoun, Greer and Boland, and Nurse Mable Wright attended her.

Mrs. Frahm and two other daughters, Hazel, 7, and Ruth, 2, were also in the car when the accident occurred. None of them was injured.

The Frahm family is moving from Denison, Ia., to their new home at Eleventh and Mason streets.

Federal Judge T. C. Minger, who had been assigned to preside over the hearing, adjourned court after noon when it is expected further developments will be announced and probably the appointment of the new receiver.

Binghamton, Aug. 27.—Six persons were killed and a seventh probably fatally injured when their automobile was struck at Gray's Crossing by an Erie railroad train early Sun day.

The dead: M. Rodis, Tony Kamin sky, Kate Huberik, Mary Huberik, all of Endicott, and Frank Hardick and Katy Twaryons of Binghamton.

All were between 25 and 35 years old. The accident occurred in a dense fog.

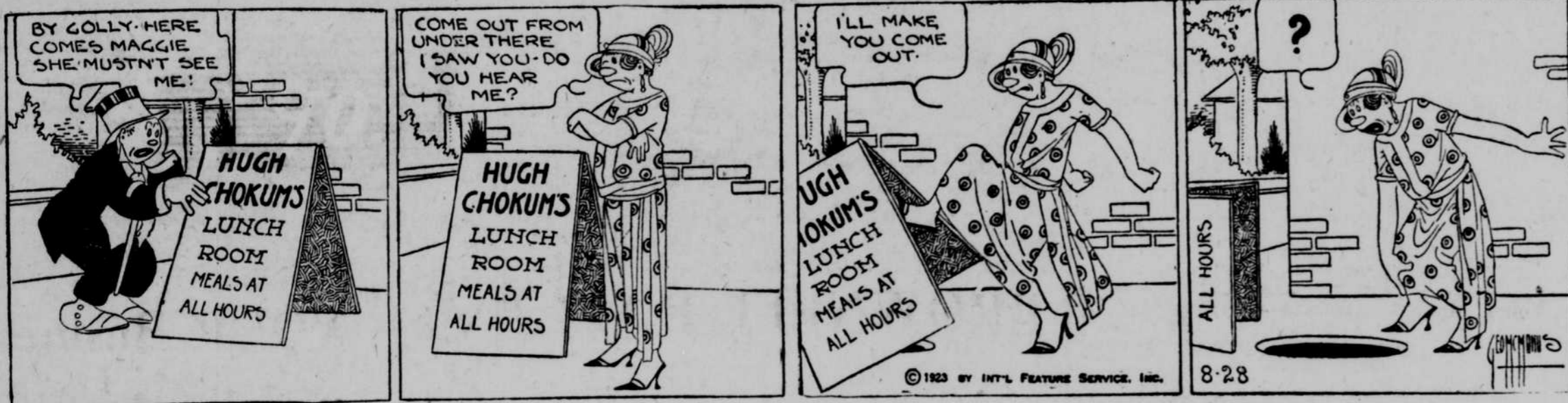

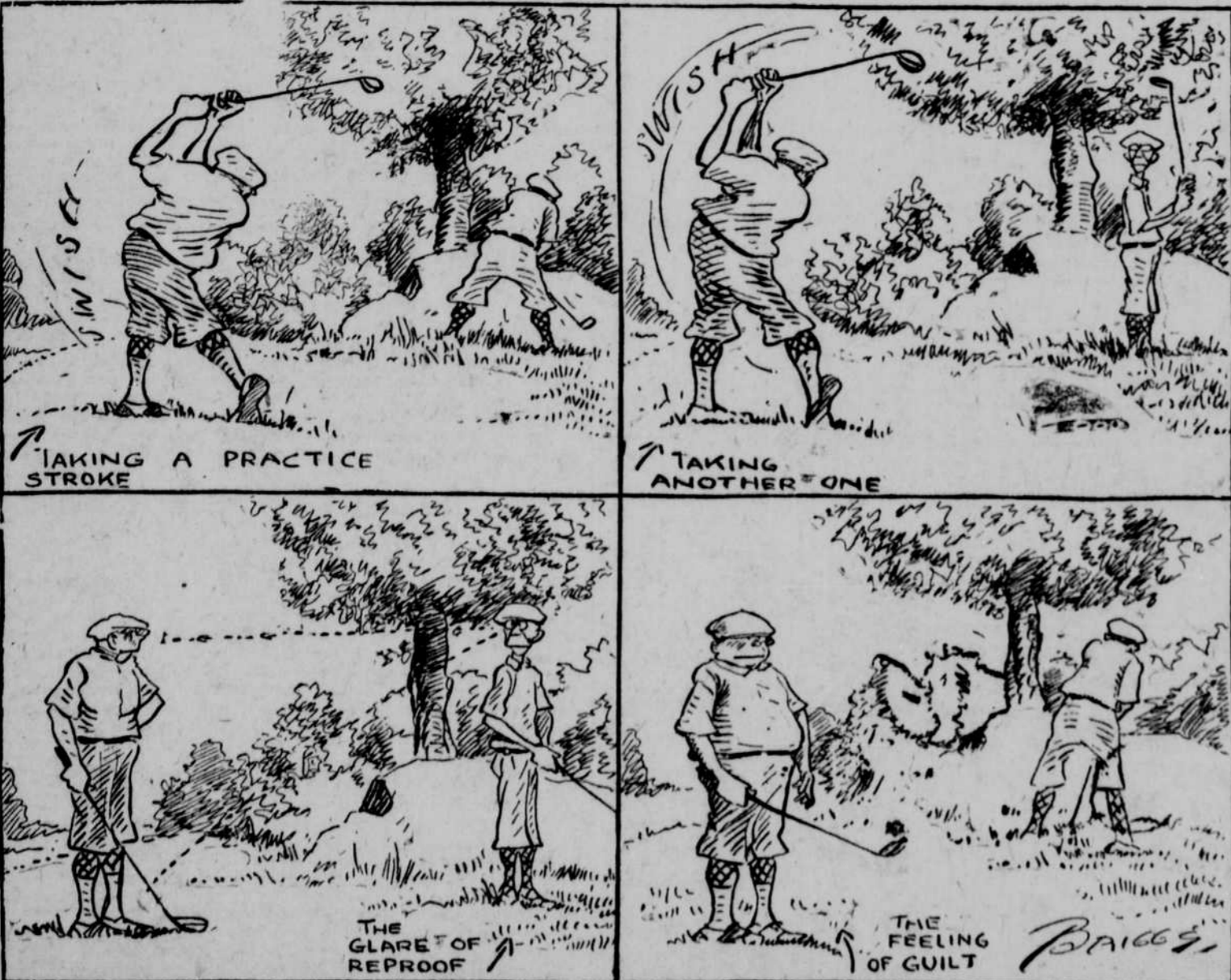

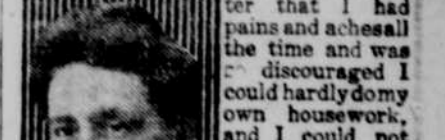
